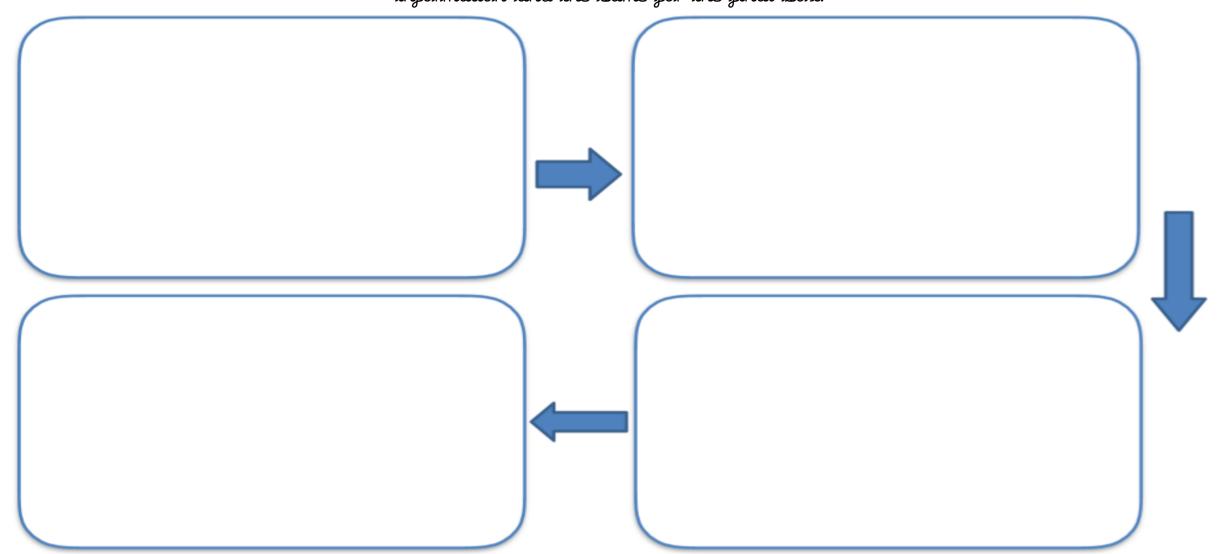




Retrieval Relay Race After Lesson 6
