# Marine Academy Primary Remote Learning Information





### **Remote Learning Information**

In September 2020, all our classes returned to full-time education following the COVID-19 closure in March. This was then followed by a further National lockdown in January 2021 forcing us to once again provide Remote Learning for most children. Although we hope that the majority of our children will soon have an uninterrupted experience, there is the possibility that individual children or groups of children will need to self-isolate for a period of time. We have therefore put in place a plan for remote learning so that all children can continue with an Outstanding education whilst taking into account safeguarding concerns, pupil numbers attending during the school closure, staffing capacity, the age of the pupils and children's access to devices.

Our Remote Learning offer meets, and often exceeds, the expectations set out in the DfE guidance 'Remote Education Support'.

All documents will be outlined on the <u>'Remote Learning'</u> tab on our Marine Academy Primary website. On this page will be important information regarding remote learning during absence from school.

Paper packs of learning will be provided to all children, posted weekly. These will include learning books to record learning and all resources necessary to be successful in their learning. Lessons will include a mixture of videos of teachers and written instructions. If a child does not have access to a computer/laptop and/or the internet, the school will do all it can to support children and learning situations for each family are updated weekly. Parents will be reminded and encouraged to make the school aware of any barriers to accessing remote learning. Where applicable, remote devices (e.g. an IPad) and/or data packages will be sought, with a priority for disadvantaged children.

Weekly packs cover content from across the curriculum, in line with the National Curriculum Learning Objectives for each Year Group. Learning is differentiated where necessary for children with particular learning needs, in line with the support they would have been given in school.

In addition to this, all children have access to Timetables Rockstars, Education City, MyOn and our Marine Academy Primary YouTube account. All families have also been supplied with a list of <u>educational websites</u> that they may like to use to complement the learning packs. We also recognise the importance of physical activity as part of the school day and recommend that Parents/Carers encourage their children to access Fitter Future.

### The Oak National Academy.

Families are also able to access <u>The Oak National Academy</u>. Funded by the Department for Education, Oak is the online classroom made by real teachers, with free, high-quality video lessons and resources. Almost 10,000 free lessons and resources. Oak National Academy is the main resource

that we have been using to provide learning at home for children having to self-isolate. Their lessons and resources cover a wide range of subjects, from Early Years Foundation Stage to Year 11.

Each lesson is an hour-long and is delivered by a teacher, with a pre-recorded video as well as quizzes, worksheets and creative activities. It's all easy to use, there's no login or password, you can access lessons on any device, and pupils only need materials they can find at home.

### Contact with pupils/ parents

Teachers will make a weekly phone call to each family to speak to the parent/carers to discuss their Remote Learning and then also speak to the individual child. This is a time for them to share any concerns and limitations to Remote Learning but also to celebrate the successes.

Families are also able to email the year group email addresses at any point with queries and celebrations.

All children identified as vulnerable have been invited in to school each day and a member of the Admin team will make contact should they not be present.

### Data protection

All guidance for staff is covered within the <u>Data Protection Policy</u>. When accessing personal data, all staff members will only use their official school email account and connect to the school network using their school laptop only. Children and families will be reminded of our <u>Online Safety Policy</u> where necessary.

Families are able to request for learning photos not be posted on Marine Academy Primary in line with our photo consent policy and any photos of home environments are monitored to ensure they do not include any compromising material.

### Sharing personal data

Staff members are unlikely to need to collect and/or share personal data. However, if it does become necessary, staff are reminded to collect and/or share as little personal data as possible online. All data collection will be compliant with GDPR guidelines.

### Keeping devices secure

All staff will take appropriate steps to ensure their devices remain secure. Computers should be locked if left inactive for a period of time and particular attention should be paid to this if the individual lives in shared accommodation. Operating systems must be up to date and staff members are always to install the latest updates.
