Marine Academy Primary PE and Sport Premium Funding 2016 – 2017

PE and Sport Premium for Primary Schools: Where the Funding is spent...

Project: Marine Academy Council Sports Partnership

Cost: £1,000.00

Aim: to provide a broader range of opportunities for the children to be inspired and take part in a range of different sports.

Outcome: children develop their confidence in sporting activities and PE and also develop a better understanding of how to live a healthy lifestyle through active engagement in sport and PE. Children will also be provided with the opportunity to take part in competitive sports.

Project: CPD for Staff

Cost: £150.00

Aim: to develop specialist PE knowledge across the team.

Outcome: Teachers and TAs further their confidence in the delivery of high quality PE. Staff training provided for all of KS1 and KS2 in the Fundamentals through the RealPE programme.



Project: Extra-Curricular Taekwondo and Taekwondo Lessons

Cost: £1,000.00

Aim: to develop children's self-esteem and confidence through sport whilst providing them with a life skill in self-defence.

Outcome: children develop their confidence in Taekwondo through specialist teaching sessions every week, with a different year group learning it each term. Children will also be provided with the opportunity to take part in an extra-curricular activity based in the form of Taekwondo. Therefore engaging in further physical activity outside of the Academy day.

Project: PE Resources

Cost: £2,775.00

Aim: to broaden PE resources across the Academy and purchase RealPE.

Outcome: a broader range of PE resources are available to re-energise school sport, with a focus on competition and creating a sporting habit for life for our pupils. Teachers are provided with a structured set of teaching and learning resources to support the successful planning and teaching of PE.

Project: Plymouth School Sports Partnership (PSSP)

Cost: £3,000.00

Aim: extend experiences and build confidence.

Outcome: one afternoon per week a specialist PE teacher provides CPD for class teachers through the delivery of a variety of sports. The children will also benefit from an increased participation in inter-school competitions from across our Academic Council and targeted children will take part in a Change4Life Club. The specialist PE teacher will also provide support with our Silver Mark PE application.

Project: Extra-Curricular Sports Clubs (Rounders, Football, Basketball, Multi Skills)

Cost: £1,000.00

Aim: to broaden sporting opportunities and a love of sport across the Academy.

Outcome: staff members will identify 'non-participants' in extra-curricular sport and provide additional activities to encourage their immediate and longer-term participation in sport and physical activity.

PE and Sport Premium Statement

Schools receive PE and Sport Premium funding based on the number of pupils in Years 1 to 6. In most cases, the amount received is determined by how many pupils at the Academy attract the funding using data from the January school census.

Schools must spend the funding to improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils but they are free to choose the best way of using the money.

For example, you can use your funding to:

- ★ hire specialist PE teachers
- ★ hire qualified sports coaches to work with teachers
- ★ provide existing staff with teaching resources to help them teach PE and sport
- ★ support and involve the least active children by running or extending school sports clubs, holiday clubs and Change4Life clubs
- ★ run sport competitions or increase pupils' participation in the School Games
- ★ run sports activities with other schools.

Objectives in Spending PE and Sport Premium Funding

The aims of the Academy are to continue to raise standards and aspirations in Physical Education and to further widen the access of a range of different sports, dance and gymnastic activities. Throughout the year children will receive some specialist sports teaching within their PE lessons and have access to a wide range of daily sporting clubs during extra-curricular activities. We seek to improve the competitive skills of groups and individuals through competitive sports days as well as taking part in a wider range of competitions and events across the city of Plymouth and our Academic Council. All of our children are divided into four houses which adds a competitive element to their PE sessions and a sense of camaraderie and team working.

Less able and reluctant pupils are encouraged to join in extra-curricular activities and may be asked to support some of the younger children attending the club.

We aim to promote the physical wellbeing of our pupils whilst developing core skills to use across the curriculum, including leadership, resilience, teamwork and collaboration.

Summary of PE and Sport Premium Funding for the 2016/17 Academic Year

Outcomes to Date

- ★ All extra-curricular activities are oversubscribed, with over 75% of the Academy's population taking part in a sporting club after school. This is a 25% increase on last year's participation.
- ★ 10% of Key Stage 2 children have been involved in planning, leading and officiating activities throughout the academic year, including the KS1 and EYFS Sports Afternoons.
- ★ A wide variety of PE and sport are taught on a daily basis and RealPE has been used to inform this teaching, following some very high quality CPD that all teachers received.
- ★ There are increased opportunities for competitive sport, including inter-house competitions and external opportunities through our Academic Council and Plymouth School Sport Partnership. Children have been taken part in Boccia, Archery, Rounders, Athletics, Football, Rowing, Dance and Multi Skills competitions this academic year.
- ★ Marine Academy Primary have achieved the Sainsbury's School Games Mark – Silver. In addition to the progress made in children's resilience, respect, determination and involvement in sport last year. The Primary has now been praised for its large percentage of children attending active extra-curricular activities, having such a proactive and positive attitude towards PE and constantly sharing with Parents/Carers information about all of the sporting events that are children have participated in. We are delighted to achieve an award for the second year running and will work towards achieving the Gold award next year.

- ★ Through Plymouth School Sport Partnership and the Marine Academic Council Sports Partnership, we have had a specialist PE teacher to work alongside staff and children to develop expertise, access to city wide sporting events (Level 2 competition), access to family events and competitions in our area and provision and use of specialist coaches – Bikeability, Balanceability, Rock Climbing, Orienteering and Bell Boating. The specialist PE teacher has also led a Change4Life club for targeted children.
- ★ Children have developed their self-control and found ways to manage their emotions through the transferrable skills learnt in PE.
- ★ There have been increased opportunities for the children to experience being part of a team and understand their contribution to it.
- ★ The children are learning to win with pride and lose with grace. They are also learning the importance of practice and preparation
- ★ Increased resources in PE have supported the high quality delivery of PE across the Academy.
- ★ Marine Academy Primary children have benefited from Taekwondo lessons and a Taekwondo extra-curricular activity. This has developed the children's confidence and provided the learners with an opportunity to engage in further physical activity outside of the academy day.
- ★ Children in Years 4 and 5 have been coached by players from Plymouth Raiders Basketball Club and had the opportunity to watch a Plymouth Raiders game and meet the team. The children who attended the extra-curricular activity also had the opportunity to have a training session on the Raiders' home court.
