Reception

Wow, what a busy and exciting term so far! The children have been impeccably behaved when taking part in the multiple events we've had this year such as, The Pearson Award Celebration, Sports Day and the Special Gentlemen event!

The children had a fantastic time on our recent trip to Dartmoor Zoo and demonstrated excellent MAP manners They had brilliant questions for all the staff; we loved how inquisitive they were!

We have continued to learn about a range of books including Handa's Surprise, The Selfish Crocodile and Going on a Lion Hunt. The children have learnt about a range of key words including 'nibbled', 'shaggy', 'creamy' and 'tangy'.

Pre-School

Pre-School have had a few busy weeks so far this term. Our theme is 'What can I grow?' and the children have enjoyed learning about Jack and the Beanstalk and The Enormous Turnip books. The children planted some seeds and watched them grow. We also explored different vegetables. We talked about where they grew and used magnifying glasses to look at the vegetables more closely.

Some of the children have also enjoyed their Stay and Play sessions in Reception, where they have been excited to meet their new teachers and have had fun in their new classrooms. Pre-School have also enjoyed Sports Day and loved a visit from Sam, the dog groomer, with Mabel her canine friend, as part of the 'Dream Big' day.



Nursery

This month, Turtle Class have really enjoyed the start of our topic rhyme 'Old MacDonald' and our topic book 'Dear Zoo'. 

She had a total of 67 bags; that's an amazing £670 for Cancer Research UK.



ONLINE SAFETY

ONLINE CHAT

Following a recent <u>report by the BBC</u> detailing how a child was asked for inappropriate images when chatting online, it is important to be aware of the dangers that may occur when using the Internet. In addition to social media apps that include a chat facility, most online games also allow communication, for example FIFA and Fortnite. Depending on the game, this may be via the in-game text chat, direct messages or talking through headphones. Some games do offer the ability to switch communication off or restrict bad language so make sure settings appropriate to your child are set up for each of the games they play.

Risks with chatting online:

- Bullying
- Inappropriate chat children may encounter explicit or inappropriate content.
- Contact from strangers talk to your child about who is contacting them online.
- Sharing personal information talk to your child about what information they share with others including images.

Recommended actions:

- Ensure your child is accessing age-appropriate apps/games and that appropriate parental controls are set up.
- Chat to your child about the risks above so they are aware of what can happen online. Depending on the age of your child, it may be more appropriate for devices to be used in family rooms so you can monitor what they are doing and if they are chatting to others.

LEGO Build and Talk

LEGO® have created Build and Talk to help you chat to your child about online safety. The activities have been created for children ages 6 to 9. Firstly, you pick an activity to do and then you read a story, which includes questions and conversation prompts, whilst you build LEGO® together. This is a fantastic way to start talking to your child about topics such as screen time and cyberbullying. Find out more here.
