New *this* Month

Year 4 – What a fantastic term we have all had in Year 4! In English, the children have loved writing their innovated adventure story after reading their text 'Arthur and the Golden Rope'. This text linked nicely with their History topic 'Vikings'. This topic has highlighted several opportunities for the children to recall their Anglo-Saxon knowledge from Term Three and it is evident that they are able to compare and contrast the different eras. Children have been really positive about their Computing learning this term. Our focus has been on creating a new game in Scratch, where they were able to create new sprites with infinite loops. In Maths, we have been focusing on decimals and the children have a thorough understanding of their place value, multiplication and division knowledge, which has been covered in previous terms. We are looking forward to all of the fun opportunities that will arise in the final term!

Year 6 – We are so proud of Year 6. They worked tirelessly to prepare and complete their end of Key Stage 2 Assessments and their commitment and effort were inspiring. To celebrate we had a Silent Disco and went to Mount Edgcumbe, where the children all enjoyed a day of relaxing and playing games. This term, Year 6 have also enjoyed their History learning about 'Twentieth Century Conflict'. They have looked into how WWI and WWII begun and discussed what they thought was most important in starting the wars. Next, we are really looking forward to enjoying Year 6's last term of primary school!

Year 1 – The children in Year 1 have had a fantastic month of May! The children had a wonderful time celebrating the coronation and enjoyed taking part in a range of outdoor learning activities. The children displayed super British values throughout the day and enjoyed tucking in to a whole school meal in the corridor. The children have continued to impress with their knowledge of the Ancient and modern-day Olympic Games. They learnt lots of facts about athletes such as Jesse Owens and Ellie Simmonds. The children were also able to compare and contrast the Ancient and modern-day Olympic Games. All of the children have been working really hard to prepare themselves for their Phonics screening checks which will take place in June. They have been reviewing all of the sounds they have learnt this year and undertaking practice papers to familiarise themselves with the format of the check. The Year 1 team are so proud of the excellent progress the children have made and can't wait to see them show off all they have learnt in June. The children have shown super resilience in their Maths lessons where they have been learning to count in 2s, 5s and 10s. In English lessons, the children read the story 'Stuck' and learnt facts about animals from the book, 'Creature Features'. The Year 1 team hope the children have a lovely restful half term and look forward to their final term. In Year 1 we have lots of exciting things happening in June, including Sports Day and the Class Assemblies.

Reception – What a wonderful month the Reception children have had, learning all about 'Splendid Safari!' The children thoroughly enjoyed their visit to Paignton Zoo, where they learnt some new facts about African safari animals. During Themed Learning, the children have learnt about the differences between England and Ghana, as well as creating safari animal patterns. It has been great to see the children become confident writers, creating their own mini books and posters. Their reading and writing progress has certainly impressed us. The children have increasingly enjoyed the outdoor space this month, role playing in our cafe, acting in our theatre and using their imagination skills in the mud kitchen. It has been an excellent term and we cannot wait to learn something new in our 'Ready, Steady... Grow' topic.

Year 5 – Year 5 have had a super month of great learning across the curriculum. They have visited the Barbican and Hoe to explore the Tudor buildings and historic Plymouth landmarks, in order to complement their History learning about the city of Plymouth. In addition, the children have learnt about some famous explorers with links to the city, how the city has been fortified and the impact of the Blitz during World War Two. In English, Year 5 have written some fantastic innovated stories about the retrieval of a magic item based on the wonderful book 'Cloud Tea Monkeys'. Also, they have produced well-presented tourist guides about the best places to visit and activities to do in Plymouth. In Maths, the children have concluded their fractions learning by finding fractions of whole numbers and applying their skills to answering word problems. Some further highlights during May have included the children programming a quiz on Scratch, writing some creative poetry about the effects of plastic bags on marine life within SMSC and successfully reflecting on the various stages of human development in their Science lessons.

Year 2 – The Year 2 team have been so proud of the children's attitudes and resilience, this term. Their perseverance has been inspirational throughout SATs, and the amount of Dojo points we have been awarded, has been amazing! In English, the children have been recounting their trip to the zoo. I am sure we will have plenty of new personal best to share and prizes to give. The children have been equally amazing in Maths and have wowed the team with their knowledge of time. In Science, the children have performed many exciting experiments, to do with plant growth. The children are looking forward to continuing to care for these over the holidays. We have all loved our History topic this term. Lots of the children really enjoyed our VE day party and we are looking forward to producing some creative writing next term, based on our emotions around evacuees. We would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your continued support. It has been a pleasure being able to talk to so many of you during parents/careers

Magic Wand Fruit Kebabs

Ingredients

Pineapple

Apples

Strawberries

Bananas

Watermelon

Equipment

Chopping boards

Sharp knife (adult use only)

Child-safe knives

Star-shaped cookie cutters

Wooden kebab skewers
(blunt-ended if possible)

Method

1. Before the activity, prepare the wooden skewers by boiling them in hot water. This will stop them from splintering.
2. Wash your hands and put on an apron.
3. Next, wash the fruit.
4. Then, an adult should remove the skin from the pineapple, watermelon and apple (optional).
5. Cut the apple, pineapple and banana into chunks, and the strawberries into halves. Children can use child-safe knives to cut the soft fruit like the bananas, pineapple and strawberries.
6. Cut the watermelon into slices.
7. Use the cookie cutters to cut star shapes out of the slices of watermelon.
8. Lay out the fruit pieces and carefully place onto the skewers. Children should be closely supervised for this activity, as the skewers can be very sharp. Model how to push the fruit onto the skewers, without putting their hands behind the fruit where the skewer will come through it.
9. A star-shaped piece of watermelon can be the final piece of fruit placed onto the top of the skewer to finish the magic wand fruit kebab.

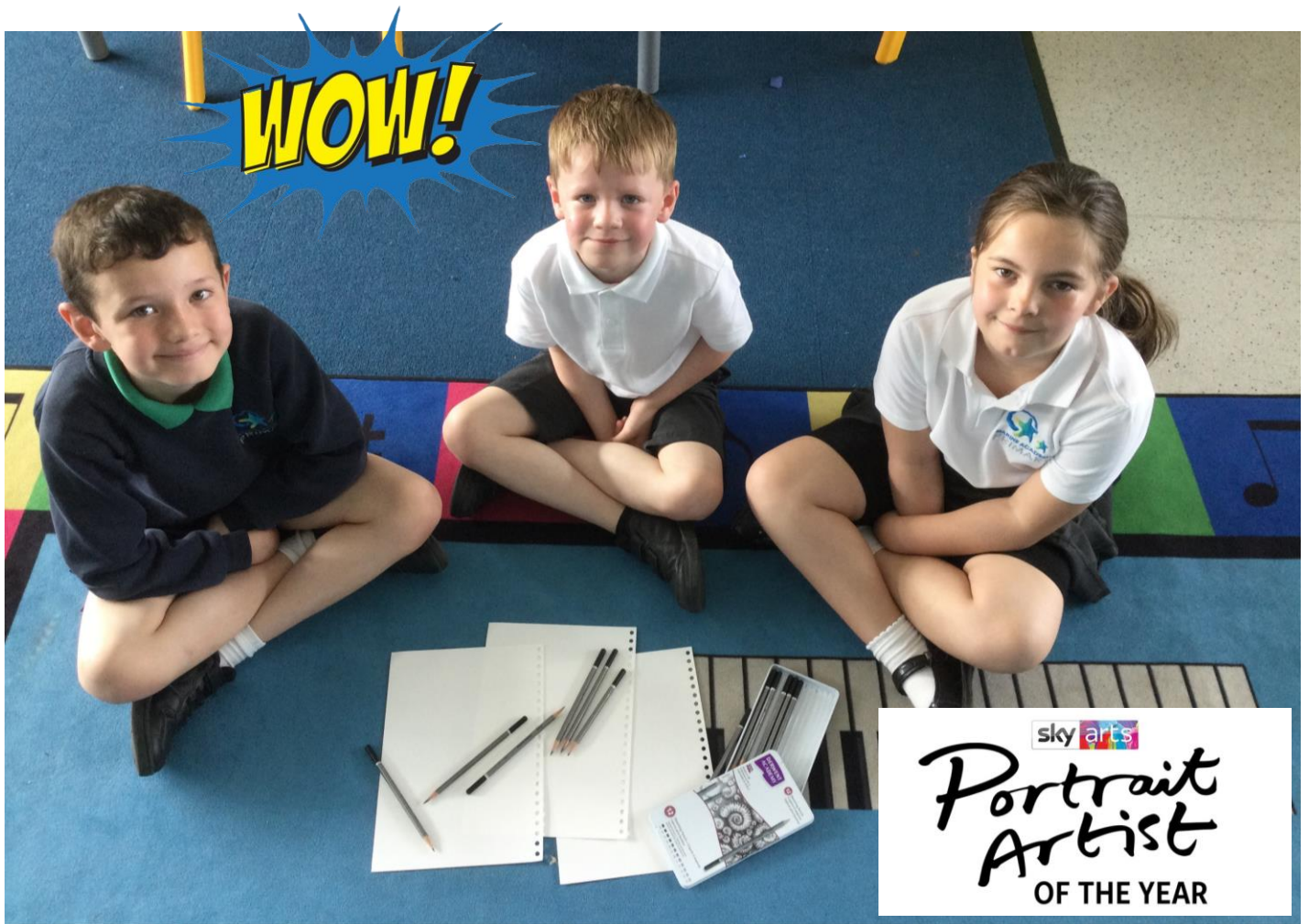

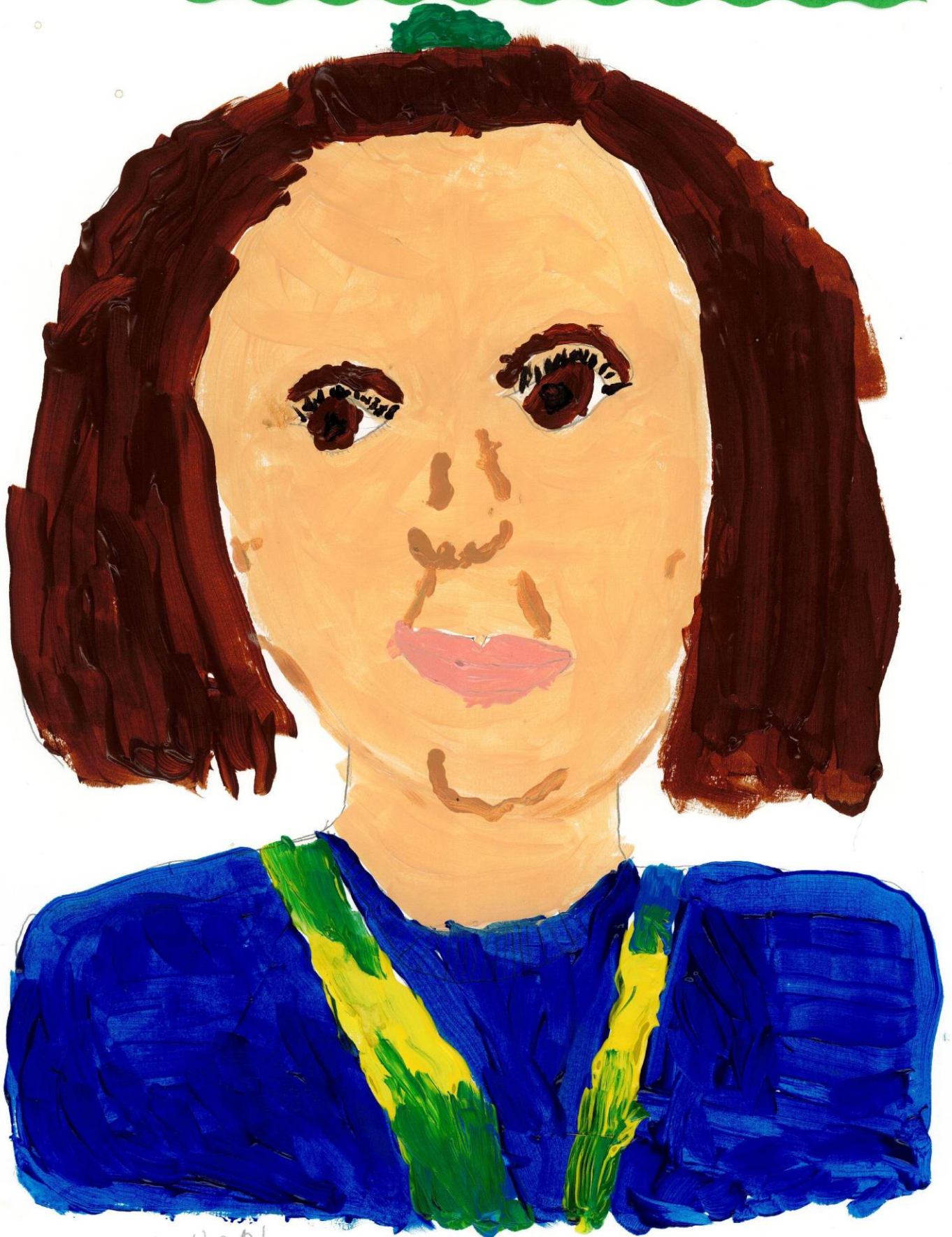

If you fall into cold water

FLOAT

1. Fight your instinct to swim
2. Lean back in the water to keep your airway clear
3. Push your stomach up, stretching out your arms and legs
4. Gently move your hands and feet to help you float
5. Float until you feel calm
6. When you are calm raise your hand and shout for help or swim to safety if you can.

You should NOT swim here




